

MIBC: Chemotherapy

If you have been told you have muscle invasive bladder cancer (MIBC), chemotherapy may be part of your treatment. Chemotherapy treatment is administered in an oncology department and during your treatment you will be looked after by the oncology team, including an oncologist and chemotherapy nurse.

I am having:

- Neo-Adjuvant chemotherapy (before radiotherapy or surgery)
- Concurrent chemotherapy
- Adjuvant chemotherapy
- Other chemotherapy

The anticipated schedule for chemotherapy varies depending on:

- The type, size, and location of the cancer
- Your age
- Your general health
- Other factors that are different for each person

Chemotherapy Schedule

You will receive a treatment schedule and care plan from the chemotherapy unit. This will include information on:

- The Chemotherapy suite (name of unit and its location)
- Your chemotherapy keyworkers name and contact telephone number
- Emergency contact number
- When to contact the emergency number
- The name of your chemotherapy
- The planned chemotherapy schedule (cycle)
- Treatment symptoms
- Medication to help lessen treatment symptoms
